3) For last minute, weekend trips, call our PVS Activities Answering Service at 362-4724. Brooke and Mary may be able to help you with carpool partners for a local trip.



EXCOM REPORT

The Executive Committee of PVS held its monthly meeting in Rockville, Maryland on Tuesday November 22nd. The "ghost" and "Chostess" for this meeting were Gerry and Sandie Deighton (and they certainly were "ghostly"!) But, back to business - which EXCOM did conduct with the spiritual presence of our hosts. Attending were President Ray McKinley, Vice President Marilyn Clark, EXCOM members Gail Gell, Bill Hager, Julie King and Bob Marx; Safety Advisor Larry Pease and 1001 editor Dick King (where were the Deightons?).

The business discussed follows:

1. An official resignation from the EXCOM has been received from Penny Richards. Penny, a brand new mother this past year, has not been able to find enuff time in the day and night to raise her family and keep up with other outside activities: thus has reluctantly submitted her resignation from EXCOM. President Ray McKinley has expressed his official disappointment (with full understanding of the circumstances) and his thanks to Penny for her able efforts when she was able to participate in Club officer activities. A vote was held to fill Penny's vacant position on EXCOM and Gail Gell was unanimously and willingly voted into EXCOM to complete Penny's term.

A lengthy discussion ensued concerning the administration of Applicant members and their progress to full membership. The Blue Ridge Ski Council is sponsoring a series of three racing clinics during the month of December. They are at Jack Frost Mt. Dec. 10-11, Dec. 17-18, and Elk Mt. Dec. 26-29. The details (or at least most of Jack Frost them) are: Price: \$12 per day This includes lifts and 3 hours of on-snow instruction. Registration: 9am at the ski school desk On-snow instruction periods are from 10-11:30 am and 2-3:30 pm daily. The first on-snow session will be for orientation, dividing into smaller groups of similar skiing levels, and free skiing instruction. The second and third on-snow sessions will be running gates and/or additional free skiing instruction depending on the meeds of the group. A timed race will be held during the fourth session. Jack Frost now has video taping to aide in its instruction. The period 11:30 am to 2 pm is reserved for lunch and free skiing. We will also have sessions on equipment maintenance and physical conditioning. These will be held after the Saturday afternoon on-snow session. This will be the for-mat for both Jack Frost clinics. This clinic will be mat for both Jack Frost clinics. suitable for beginning through advanced racers. Elk Mt.

Price: \$60 for four days plus lift tickets Registration: 6:30 am at a special desk in the rear of the main lodge Discount lift tickets can be purchased at the registration desk. Slalom Trail will be reserwed for racing instruction. Participants in the clinic will be permitted to use the racers! lift line at the new double chair. There will be heavy emphasis on runming gates both SL and GS. There will be instruction in course setting and topics such as equipment maintenance and racing strategy will be covered in off-snow classes. There will be a get acquainted beer, pretzel, etc. party on Monday, the 26th. Instruction sessions will be from 9:30-12 and 1-4 each day. Enrollment will be limited to about 45.
