PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

In the 1976 Winter Olympics, Bill Koch of the United States won a medal in cross country skiing. A decade ago that achievement would have been greeted with the kind of hysteria currently only seen at croquet matches. However, in todays environment the excitement over Koch's triumph reflects the sudden new interest in cross country (nordic) skiing in the U.S.

Like tennis, jogging and alpine skiing, cross country skiing is a rapidly growing sport. Nordic and apline skiing share similar looking equipment and a similar season. The similarity ends there however. Cross country is more serene as skiers glide through snow-laden trees and along brooks. The cross country skier is not always required to go downhill, he can go on flat country or uphill. He also has no use for large vertical drops and expensive lift tickets. This type of skiing is inexpensive, exhilarating, and just an enjoyable way to spend a day.

You don't need to be an expert to enjoy cross country and rental equipment is downright cheap. We hope that you will join us for a day when we do PVS's first ever cross country skiing. See elsewhere in this issue and in last months issue of TOOT for further details.
