PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

We've had more Events, more trips, greater participation and, of course, more verbose Presidential messages! We hope that the coming year will be even better (but not necessarily more verbose). And we're making plans to assure that it is. We've got some great new Events planned as well as some outstanding ski trips - including a one week trip to New England. This is certainly going to be the year to be in PVS - - I'U bet you will even want to invite your skiing friends to join. Let me tell you the reason for my enthusiasm. For openers, we will continue to run two summer Events each month as we did so successfully last year. We start off with a new Event: a Bicycle trip on July 8th. Starting Time: 11:00 A.M.

Length of bike trip: 16-20 miles round trip.

The Elrod's Steak and Swim

What: A steak cookout and swimming pool swim, at Roy and Malda Elrod's in Triangle, Virginia. Bring your swim suits: your plates and utensils, your towels, and your appetites!

When: From 2:00 P.M. 'til dark on Saturday, July 15th. (Rain date: July 16th).

How Much: A nominal charge will be charged to cover cost of food and drinks. This will be figured and pro-rated at the picnic and will not be too high (last year's charge was

in the vicinity of \$4.00 per person).

How To Get There: Take Route 95 south toward Richmond. Take the Dumfries/Manassas exit from Route I-95. Go left on Route 234, south on old Route #1, to Virginia Route 1107 at the Triangle Plaza sign, follow 1107 to a T type dead end, bear right on Cabin Road to the third left which is RIVERVIEW DRIVE. Proceed to 3213 Riverview Drive AND YOU ARE THERE. Come early and enjoy a full day outdoors with your PVS friends (and guests; this is a good Event for meeting and making new friends for yourselves and for PVS).

Reservations Required: The D.C. Coordinator for this Event is Julie King (530-4966). While Julie is away July 1-12, you may call Malle McKinley (790-8812) for reservations. Some people will be asked to bring salads; others will bring desserts. It will be the usual

outstanding Event it has always been in the past! Sign up early!

Dot Mason provides the following information about the September hike:

Sept. 23. Scenic hike on the Appalachian Trail in the northern part of the Shenandoah National Park. Ups and downs but not difficult. Crisscrossing Skyline Drive, you can hike as little as 4½ miles, as much as 9, depending on your speed. Everyone off the Trail by 4:00 for beer. Pot luck dinner at the Mason's mountain place north of Front Royal. Meet at the Cooper School, Rte. 173 in Va. just off Beltway at 9:00 a.m. to arrange carpooling. Sturdy shoes recommended but not mandatory. Bring lunch and canteen. Rain date Sept. 24. Jenckes and Dot Mason, 652-4313.

A TOOT TIDBIT For those interested in Mt. Sutton, Canada: from Kirk Burns.

A fifth chairlift is being installed on Mt. Sutton this summer. The location is beyond the present Chair # 4 (farthest from the Burns' chalet). Length: As a minimum, from Exil (above the top of Chair #4) down to the creek road at the bottom of the valley (well below the bottom of Chair #4). It is reported that a sixth chairlift will be installed NEXT year! This one will probably be near Chairlift #1 which is very near the Burns chalet. That's called progress. And, at one of our favorite shi areas, too. It has been a good mountain in the past; and it will be better in the future! See you all there!

The Summer Gala at Kirk and Peggy Burns. August 12th (Rain date: August 13th)

This notice is included in the July 7007 since it takes place early in August and the August

7007 would probably not arrive at members' homes in time. So, here it is:

A SUMMER CALA at 6503 Waterway Drive, Falls Church, Virginia. The Burns have a full day of activities (and non-activities) ready for you: swim, dive, sunbathe, float on a tube (bring your own), sail, row, paddle, slide on the water slide, hike upstream, play horseshoes, badminton, eat lunch if you come early enuff, sleep, eat again at the picnic supper and then dance (or be a people watcher) until the wee hours. Come anytime after 11:30 A.M. and don't plan to do a thing that might break the party up before midnight. Bring lunch (if early), food for dinner, bathing suit, towel, daytime clothes, informal evening garb and sun (we hope) protection. There will be two charcoal grills available, picnic tables and chairs. If you have a grill, picnic table or chair handy, please bring them along. The rain date will be effective only if the C & P forecast on Saturday morning calls for a much higher chance of rain on Saturday than Sunday. We did have some rain on the last two Galas but things turned out beautifully - a little more time is simply spent inside! We hope to see you all there:

DIRECTIONS

If coming from Washington, use Arlington Blvd. (Route 50). As you leave Arlington County and approach Seven Corners, look for Montgomery Ward on your right. Turn left at the next light onto Patrick Henry Drive (Greenwood Restaurant on the left). Continued below ...

#2

Beltway If using the Beltway, exit at #8 (Route 50) and take the service road to 8E (towards Washington), and turn right at the 4th light onto Patrick Henry Drive (this light is the first light after driving under all the overpasses at Seven Corners). As soon as you are past the overpasses, exit onto the service road in order to make the right turn at the light. You can't turn right from the main road (route 50). Continued below ...

#1 and #2 continued

Continue straight on Patrick Henry Drive through the first light (crossing Route 7, Leesburg Pike) and follow Patrick Henry Drive to the end ("T"). Turn right onto Beachway Drive and go one block to the end ("T"). Turn left onto Potterton Drive. Cross a small bridge and bear left onto Waterway Drive (avoid right turn onto Stoney Brae). Follow Waterway Drive 5 long blocks to 6503 (left side of street). Street signs give you the . block numbers. The house across the street from 6503 has colonial pillars and sits on a small hill. There is a row of Virginia cedars across the front of 6503; the number is painted on a rock at the top of the driveway. Please use the criveway to unload; but park outside; drive out again and park along Waterway Drive or turn right and then left and park on Old Farm Road.

An alternate route is Columbia Pike, which can be reached from Route 236 (Annandale) or I-95 (near the Pentagon). From Columbia Pike turn right (from the Pentagon) or left (from Annandale) onto Sleepy Hollow Road. Follow Sleepy Hollow down a long hill and across a small bridge. Turn onto Dearborn and follow it to the fork, and right and onto Waterway Drive. 6503 is the 7th house on the right counting from the beginning of the fork.
