September Hike

Some twenty-six hardy P V S members met at Cooper Jr. High School in McLean on September 23rd for the car pooled ride to the Shenandoah National Park for the scheduled hike there. Everything went off like clockwork thanks to the good organizational abilities of Jencks and Dot Mason who did more than a yeoman's task to have everything (including dinner later in their mountain retreat) under the greatest control. The group found the forest covered with a pervasive ground fog but the fog did nothing to dampen the enthusiasm of the collected group. In fact, it added a good degree of drama to the planned hike. The group divided itself into two segments: a five mile hike and a ten mile hike. It was a ham dinner with an excellent combination bean salad and sweet potatoes touched off with a nice cake for dessert. It was an Event long to be remembered. We thank Jencks and Dot most sincerely for arranging this fine Event for the benefit of P V S Club members.

Due to its popularity, we present here the recipe for the excellent bean salad we had on the Mason's Shenandoah hike:

Calico Beans

8 slices of bacon
4 medium onions, chopped (Dot used two)
1 can green beans
1 can white lima beans or butter beans
1 can kidney beans
1 can (1 lb. 14 oz) B&M pork & beans
3/4 cup dark brown sugar
½ cup vinegar
½ teaspoon garlic salt
½ teaspoon dry mustard
pepper to taste

How to do it:

Fry bacon until crisp. Drain and crumble. Saute onion in bacon drippings until it is transparent. Drain onions. Drain green beans and lima or butter beans. Combine these with kidney beans and pork and beans undrained. Add onion and bacon. Combine brown sugar, vinegar, garlic salt, mustard and pepper. Add to bean mixture. Mix well. Bake uncovered in 3 quart casserole at 350° for one hour. Mixture freezes micely either before or after it has been cooked. Feeds 12 to 16 regular people — only 12 when they are hungry skiers!
