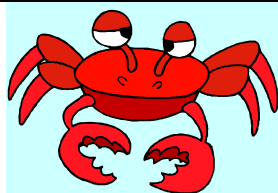

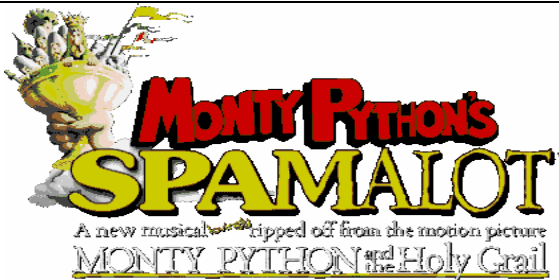

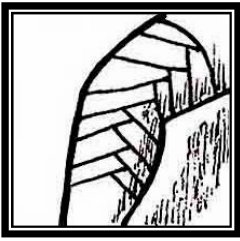

Membership Secretary's message

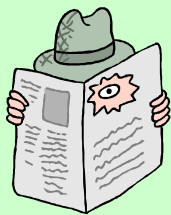
