

President's Message:



Directions to the home of Bob & Louann Eadie:

Directions from the Beltway: Take the Dulles Toll Road (Route 267) west to the Wiehle Avenue exit. Turn left onto Wiehle Avenue. Wiehle Avenue ends in a tee at Sunrise Valley Drive. Turn right onto Sunrise Valley. Go 0.4 miles to left onto Soapstone. Take the second left onto Purple Beech (first left is Durand Drive). Take your first right onto Eakins Court. 2054 is straight ahead in the cul-de-sac. There is a green mailbox by the driveway. <u>NOTE</u>: parking is limited on Eakins Court so consider parking on Purple Beech.

Another option is taking the new Silver Line metro to the Wiehle Avenue stop and either taking a taxi or walking the two miles to our house.

We are excited about our 2017 ski trips. By popular demand, we are going back to **Snowmass** in January. See the flier in this TOOT. We are happy to announce that we have put together our own Eurofest for 2017 to Val d'Isere, France. Val d'Isere is the premier ski town in France. I have skied there three other times and was hoping to get back again. It's an immense ski area of 300 km of slopes, 79 ski lifts of every sort you can imagine, 154 slopes, and 2 glaciers. The majority of the slopes are blue and red with a few black and green. The views are

spectacular and the restaurants on the mountain and in the village are outstanding. We are staying at the four-star Hotel Aigle Des Neiges, which is within walking distance of the lifts and, depending on snow conditions, you may be able to ski back to the hotel. It's within walking distance of numerous restaurants and shops. We will be running this trip with Jerry Poley from Columbia Ski Club. We are working on a pre trip to Lyon and a post trip to Nice!





As I mentioned previously, as soon as a ski season is over we are into planning for the next year. In fact, the Blue Ridge Ski Council (BRSC), of which we are a part, plans a couple years in advance. The **Ski Travel Show** took place April 29 at the Tyson Marriott. Eight PVSers attended. During this show we were able to talk to representatives from Aspen/Snowmass and other resorts. We talked to Doug Horstman who is helping us with the Snowmass trip and representatives from Holidaze who are helping with the Val d'Isere trip. Once again we will be staying <u>slope-side</u> at the Snowmass Mountain Chalet (SMC), just below the Snowmass Mall and from where you can ski directly to the lifts. Check the web-site at <u>www.mountainchalet.com</u>. This year we are offering a "Land Only" package since most people prefer to make their own arrangements. The total package includes: land transfer from Aspen airport to SMC and return; 5 day lift ticket (good for all four ski areas in the Aspen complex, free shuttle bus) with option for extra days; 7 nights lodging (double occupancy); daily breakfasts; daily soup lunch; luggage handling; a welcome reception, an "all guest" hotel sponsored party, a "pizza" party and a farewell group dinner to celebrate our trip. Additional nights at Snowmass are an option based on availability. Trip insurance is available through Encompasse Tours and is <u>highly suggested</u>. Bella Italia - My book club has been together 20 years and we decided to celebrate by traveling to Italy in early May to visit a charter member and her husband who moved to Umbria two years ago. Five of us were able to go for an eight-day extravaganza of eating pasta, drinking Italian----- wine, touring hill towns in our rented seven-person van, and talking and laughing like crazy.

Our first stay was at the agriturisimo, Calagrana, with a lunch stop at Montepulciano. We spent perfect days in the Umbrian countryside, pampered by Ely and Alberto. The highlight was Alberto's hands-on cooking class where we made a warm green salad with toasted polenta croutons and sautéed chicken livers, eggplant ravioli, and deboned and stuffed chicken legs.

We then moved on to Umbertide where our hosts live. We stayed with them and next door at their friend's apartment. We visited Perugia, Montone, Assisi,



Montefalco, Bevanga, and Orvieto. If many of these names sound vaguely familiar as names of wine regions, then you are remembering correctly. Wednesday

in Umbertide is market day and we bought the makings for our dinner. First, though, we all had huge porchetta sandwiches from the market for breakfast. We discovered the Italian aperitif, Aperol Spritz, which looks like orange Kool-Aid and tastes like bitter orange peel. We ended spending the night and eating at a onestar Michelin restaurant near the Rome airport in Fiumicino.

This was a food and wine trip and an opportunity to spend time with old friends. Of course, we can always say that we saw the Basilica at Assisi and the stunning Duomo in Orvieto, which should satisfy the questioner, but those sites were not what the trip was about. For me, it will stand as one of my most memorable trips ever.


ECLIPSE CHAMBER ORCHESTRA CONCERT

In Memory of Russell William Sweeney Jr., 1940-2016

Russell William "Bill" Sweeney Jr., 75 of Fortville, IN, passed away peacefully on May 17, 2016, surrounded by his family, following complications from pneumonia. Bill was born to Russell William and Margaret (Derrick) Sweeney on September 24, 1940. Bill married the love of his life, Bonnie Martin, on September 12, 1970.

Bill grew up in Cincinnati, OH, graduating from St. Xavier H.S. and Xavier University, prior to commissioning as a Second Lieutenant in the Adjutant General Corps in the U.S. Army. His 30-year career included a tour in Vietnam and assignments in England, Germany, France, California, Chicago, Virginia, and Battalion Command of the 14th Battalion at Fort Jackson, SC, culminating as the Garrison Commander at Fort Ben Harrison, IN. Following his military retirement in 1993, he worked with the 500 Festival Committee and then spent 10+ years as the Executive Director of the Indiana War Memorials in Indianapolis, IN. Following his retirement from the War Memorial, he stayed active in serving the military and veterans in the Indianapolis community by his involvement with AUSA, the American Red Cross, and the Indianapolis Veterans Day Council. He is a graduate of Central Michigan University, the Command and General Staff College, and the U.S. Army War College. He is also a recipient of the Maude Award.

Bill is survived by Bonnie and their daughters, LTC (ret) Elizabeth Sweeney, her husband LTC Michael Parsons, and Melissa Sweeney and her husband Tim Smith, as well as three granddaughters, Meridian, Ember, and Iris Parsons. He is also survived by his sister Patricia Sweeney Rohs, his brothers John Sweeney and Dan Sweeney, and a wonderful extended family. He was pre-deceased by his parents and his granddaughter, Amelia Merritt Parsons.

More than the accomplishments and legacy outlined above, Bill is remembered and treasured for his steel-trap mind, his sense of humor, and his ability to make anything fun. He gifted his children the sound of a flock of Canada geese honking over a quiet dawn on the Chesapeake Bay, the thrill of a taut sail skimming the water, a love of adventure, an appreciation of folk music, storytelling and for subtle and random acts of irreverence and mischief, his love of the water and the outdoors, his example of service to Country, and his courage in living and in dying. He is remembered for his sourdough pancakes, his sweet tooth, his stories, and his colorful "Billisms" best summarized by his saying that "there is no-inappropriate word in the English language as long as it is used appropriately." Memorial contributions can be made to The American Red Cross, 1510 N. Meridian Street, Indianapolis, IN 46202 and the LTG Timothy Maude Foundation, 3521 S Four Mile Run Dr., Arlington, VA 22206-2311. There will be a Celebration of Bill's life Wednesday, May 25, 2016, 2 PM, Pershing Auditorium, Indiana War Memorial, 431 N. Meridian St., Indianapolis, IN. At a later date his ashes will be interred at Arlington National Cemetery.
