BRIEF HISTORY OF PVS

A group of skiers, that had knit together in mutual misery over being stranded in Europe by a diabolic Travel Agent, decided that a small club was necessary. A Constitution and By-Laws were drawn up, discussed, revised and on November 16, 1965 Potomac Valley Skiers was incorporated. All executive and judicial powers were entrusted in a duly elected President and six Directors, the later body became the EXCOM. The club formed Phoenix like to attract and unite dedicated skiers for the purpose of fellowship and safety with activities maintained on an amateur basis.

CLUB DEVELOPMENT
