# PENNSYLVANIA SKI FEDERATION NEWS by MURRAY LYON

The PSF met at Carlisle Pa. Sept. 27 & 28. PVS was there on the 28th as a member of Blue Ridge Ski Council, represented by Hank Thomas, Larry Pease and Murray Lyon; (PSF is the parent organization of which BRSC is a member). The meeting lasted two days, with Saturday being given over largely to comittee meetings; on Sunday, the session attended by the PVS contingent, President Leo West presided, conducting a regular business meeting during which the comittees reported. A resolution was offered during this session by Larry Pease to have PSF support a bill, presently before the Penna state legislature, exempting ski areas from the 10% tax which local Pennsylvania communities may impose on anything not already taxed by the state government. Larry's resolution was adopted unanimously. PSF contends that skiing is a participator sport and provides direct benefits to the participant in the form of exercise as opposed to say sports like professional baseball games which are spectator sports and merely provide entertainment. Bowling already enjoys the exemption for which skiing asks. Nearby ski areas like Blue Knob, Charnita, Round Top and Seven Springs are all candidates for this tar (which is of course, passed directly on to you the ticket buyer) and in fact Round Top is presently required to collect this tax on it's

You, PVS members, will be asked to help oppose this tax by lending your support to the bill exempting skiing from it. Please help. It will cost you but a few minutes of your time. Combined, your small individual efforts have great potential for making the voice of the skier in general, and PVS in particular a real POWER in Bananna Belt skiing!

# PVS FALL SCINIC FOUNTAIN WALKS by II' FTY

The 1970 edition of the Fall walking season is here. Scenery, leaf-looking, fresh air and leg-loosening are yours for the taking. The leaders will be Murray Lyon and Jim Key. In response to numerous requests, we have scheduled some hikes on Saturday, some on Sunday, some South of the Potomac and some North.

We will meet for each hike directly at the starting point at 9:00 am sharp.

Saturday October 17th

Harpers Ferry
For beautiful scenery with a magnificant view of historic Harpers Ferry, join us
for this easy, five mile stroll along Elk Ridge above the Potomac. Meet at the
parking lot at the scenic overlook at Sandy Hook, Maryland where U.S. Rte 340
crosses the Potomac. From the beltway, take I-70S west to the U.S. 340 interchange at Frederick. Follow 340 west toward Harpers Ferry. Farking lot is on
your left just before you cross the Fotomac River bridge.

Another level walk with a downhill at the end; eight easy miles of ridge malking along Dickey Ridge in Virginia's beautiful Shenandoah mountains at the height of the Fall season. Meet at the Dickey Ridge Visitors' Center at mile 10 on the Skyline Drive. Take I-66 west from the Beltway to where the Interstate ends and you are dumped onto U.S. 29-211 at Gaingswille, Virginia. Immediately take a right onto Va. 55 west to Front Royal. Turn South on U.S. 340 and lock for the entrance to the Skyline Drive on the left. Go ten miles to the Dickey Ridge Visitors Center and meet PVS in the parking lot.

Sunday, November first

This is an eight mile circuit hike in the Shenandoah National Park. From Rattlesnake Point Overlook on the Skyline Drive, we'll hike down Finey Branch trail and back up the Finey Ridge trail, an easy walk with some breath-taking vistas. Take I-ll west from the Beltway to Gainesville, Virginia, thence on U.S. 25-211 to warrenton. Turn right in Warrenton on U.S. 211 to the top of the mountain and the Skyline Drive. Turn right (north) on the Drive for about 12 miles to Rattlesnake Point Overlook.

Sunday, November 8th

We'll take a leisurely circuit around the base of the famous Virginia mountain without enduring the struggle of climbing the summit. It's a beautiful walk with no hard pulls. To get to the Old Rag Parking lot, where we'll meet, take I-66 west from the Beltway and proceed as above through marrenton as if you are headed for the Skyline Drive. When you get to Sperryville clast town before the mountain), take U.S. 522 south for one mile to Va. 231. Turn right on 231 for b miles to the Hughes River. Immediately after crossing the river, turn right to Nethers and on to the end of the road and the Old Rag parking Lot.

See lennsylvania; hike a real forest. A 7 mile hike north on the Appalachian Trail past Chimney "ccks to South Mountain Sanitarium. Go west from the Beltway on I-70 to Frederick. From there take U.S. 15 north to Thurmont, Md. North of Thurmont, so left on Md 81 to Blue "idge Summit, then Pa 16 west to the Appalachian Trail. Meet at the point where the AT crosses Fa 16.

Sunday November 22nd

Ten miles of corgeous mountain views! A little more ricorous walk than some of the previous walks, but not exhausting. Meet at the matthews Arm Camperound parking not for a delightful walk in the woods. Directions to matthews Arm are similar to Rattlesnake Point Cverlook (see, Sunday, November 1st, above), except that the turnoff to the matthews Arm Camperound is about 2 miles before you get to mattlesnake Point, well marked. Join the hikers for the final walking event of the season. THINK SNOW!!
