

INTERNATIONAL DINNER RECIPES

Recipe # 12

Tomali Pie – Spanish

Pour 3 cups of milk over 1 cup of cornmeal and let stand. Fry together 2 lbs ground beef, 1 clove garlic minced, 2 chapped onions, 1 chapped green pepper. Then add 1 cup whole kernal corn drained, 1 cup green chili sauce (can buy in Giant in Spanish food section - Jalipena), 22 cups tomato sauce or 2 cans plus water to make $2\frac{1}{2}$ cups.

Add 1 can chopped ripe olives, 3 tablespoons Chili powder and 2 teaspoons salt

Put together with milk mixture.

Bake 1 howr at 375°. After & howr stir in 1 can whole ripe olives. Last 20 minutes top with Longhorn cheese. Serves 15–20.

SKI SAFETY AND PHYSICAL FITNESS contributed by: Larry Pease

Skiing CAN be fun, if you approach it correctly. Physical fitness is one of the two top factors in ski safety. Common Sense is the other. If your RODY is out of condition, it gets tired quickly and won't react in a crisis when you need it most. Muscles and ligaments that are well exercised are less apt to give out or. strain. Dynamic exercises like jogging, hiking, and biking coupled with a good program of daily exercises is a good program. If you can't find time for a disciplined program, follow these recommended activities: WALK everywhere you can, upstairs, downstairs and on the level; sit erect at all times applying isometric stretching on your backbone and other muscles of your BODY; lose weight and trim up so that your muscles and heart are NOT supporting that extra UNNECESSARY strain; and jog, jumprope and run, run, run! Your stamina and your wind can't help but improve!

These tickets are offered on a no-recourse basis, and members who buy them are urged to use them promptly. While some tickets may claim validity for one or more seasons, changes in ownership of areas, foreclosures, and other unforseen events may affect the usefulness of the lift tickets after they are issued or sold.

The tickets are available by telephone through the Eastern Division office; but the Eastern office is NOT a ticket office. Skiers on their way north are welcome to visit the offices in Brattleboro, Vt., but they will not be able to buy discount lift tickets across the counter there. Order by telephone: 802-254-6077.

Tickets will be mailed to buyers upon receipt of payment, or persons ordering tickets may do so by use of their Master Charge or BankAmericard charge numbers. Because of the cost of handling orders, a fee of \$3 will be charged on all ticket orders of under \$50.

Tickets are available on a first come-first served arrangement, so come first and don't be disappointed.

PV S President's Note: The above extract is provided to PV S members for their benefit as a direct and tangible benefit from ESA. This is all to the good. BUT, I am disappointed to report that a review of the minutes of the August 6, 1977 ESA Board of Directors, revealed NO discussion, much less movement, in support of the floor motion made at the ESA Convention in May 1977 by Ms Dania Bardia to reconsider ESA goals to be more directly supportive of recreational skier interests. This is a serious void on the part of ESA and impacts most directly on the PVS consideration whether or not to remain as a 100% ESA club. I ask our membership to consider the ESA Board of Directors' action (or lack of same) as a serious reflection of lack of genuine concern for the ESA member recreational skier.
